Bloomberg expanded on the esentation, noting that KCCD received more funding than originally ticipated and continues to compare favorably against projections. He o reported that while there is discussion at the federal level regarding tential reductions or elimination of HSI funding, Kern CCD's financial anding remains strong, and the district will continue to monitor state d federal developments that may impact college funding.
