BP/AP	Updates
AP 3430 - Prohibition of Harassment	Last update required revisions to Title IX procedures. Now, under operative 2020 Title IX, any complaint would be handled under AP 3435 Discrimination and Harassment Complaints and Investigations
AP 3436 - Hazing	Updating DCC on the campus specific process. Will move forward after finalization. Meeting with VPSSs 3/23. AP 3436 Requires coordination multiple levels- Ed Services, HR, Administrative Services/Safety and the campuses. Still working through this process. Will have a draft for the April meeting.
AP 3516 - Registered Sex Offender Information	Emailed CCC and Legal. District should use the template language applicable to districts without a police department and omit provisions that apply only where a campus police department exists. Question answered verifying that students must register at the law enforcement agency in the same jurisdiction as the school when there is no campus law enforcement. This is understood. The question now is CAN a college without law enforcement require students to ALSO register with the campus, which is what is currently reflected in in our AP.
AP 3550 - Drug-Free Environment and Drug Prevention Program	AP 3550 Will come through with AP 6950 when HR has had the opportunity to review.
AP 4232 - Pass/No Pass	Reviewing language against CCLC
AP 4235 - Credit for Prior Learning	Draft recommendation from the VPSS meeting on 03/23. Removal of 12 units residency requirement and other recommendations from best practice. Will bring draft to April meeting.
AP 5013 - Students in the Military	Draft recommendation from the VPSS meeting on 03/23. Will bring to April meeting.
AP 7600 - Campus Public Safety & 7600 Campus Police	Bringing back for first read

BP 7210 - Academic Employees	Emailed CCC and Legal. New questions after pending case. Recent changes at federal level have not altered California law applicable to community college districts. The language is still permissible under California law. Any future changes would be dependent on changes in California statute, regulation or controlling case law. Current discussions at CCA negotiations will impact recommendation. Will come to DCC when a draft is ready.
BP 7230 - Classified Employees	<p>Emailed CCC and Legal. Ed Code 88003 expressly provides that certain positions are excluded from the classified service, including all full-time students employed part-time, part-time students employed part time in work-study or work experience programs, and part-time students employed part-time as student tutors. It is legally advisable to retain the current statute specific language in BP 7230 and not broaden it to include all students. Follow-up question with legal. Initially affirmed the following:</p> <p>This missed the focus of the question, so resubmitted to ask specifically- Is there an intentional exclusion in the language of “full-time students employed part-time as tutors” vs. “part-time students employed part-time as student tutors.” The legal response seems to affirm this, but we have asked a more explicit question to verify.</p>
BP/AP 4100 - Graduation Requirements for Degrees and Certificates	Conducting a comparison between CCLC language and current BP/AP language to identify missing Title V language. Will have complete language at the April meeting.
