



## AP 4228 Course Repetition - Significant Lapse of Time

## **Rely Primarily Upon the Advice and Judgment**

## NOTE: This procedure is legally advised.

Students may be permitted or required to repeat courses in which a "C" or better grade was earned when a significant lapse of time occurred of no less than 36 months since the grade was obtained, and:

- The respective college has established a recency prerequisite for a course or program; or
- An institution of higher education to which a student wishes to transfer has established a recency requirement that the student cannot satisfy without repeating the course <u>;</u> or
- When a student needs to repeat an active participatory experience course in Physical Education, Visual Arts, Performing Arts, or a course that is related in content due to a significant lapse of time.

<u>When a student needs to repeat an active participatory experience course in</u> <u>physical education, or visual or performing arts, or that is related in content due to</u> <u>a significant lapse of time, e</u> Each repetition attempt will be counted toward the established repetition limits. However, <u>if a student has already exhausted the</u> <u>number of permitted repetitions</u>, an additional repetition due to significant lapse of time may be permitted or required by the respective college, <u>when a student has</u> <u>exhausted the number of permitted repetitions</u>.

When a course is repeated due to a significant lapse of time, the respective college may disregard the previous grade and credit when computing a student's grade point average.
