1. CALL MEETING TO ORDER*

6. INDIVIDUAL REPORTS

a. Student Organization Funding Manager, Manager Scott: The re-registration deadline is this Monday. There are currently not very many clubs reregistered. Please do so as soon as possible to make sure that all cubs can reap the benefits of being registered. Tables are available to be reserved for participating in Constitution day on September 17th from 11-2 p.m. The prize for the best table is currently tentative. Please relay this to other clubs who are not present today. Reminder that homecoming is coming up soon and the packet is now available online. There will be a tutorial after the meeting on how to clean/use the popcorn and cotton candy machine, under which only registered clubs can utilize. There are \$18,000 of SOF grants available for club usage (not for food, technology, or to pay people). More info about these grants can be found on the website, and there are also travel grants. There are limitations to the grants, but we are willing to help you.

b. BCSGA Advisor, *Dr. Damania (Interim Director):* For the home football games, we are trying to build up more of a carnival feel. We have also partnered up with Les Schwab tires to hold a competition between clubs, where one member from each club would roll a tire down the full length of the field. The winner of the competition would then win a \$100-\$200 gift care for Les Schwab tires. This will occur at every home game, so we are looking for two student organizations (and a volunteer from both clubs) to participate in the competition. This will occur at the beginning of half-time. Additionally, we are hoping clubs take advantage in having a table/booth at the football games such that you can fundraise for your club. Tables and chairs will be provided, just bring the rest of your resources. Reminder that clubs can also purchase a table covering/gazebo through SOF grants, and canopies can be checked out for future games. The Running of the Renegades will happen this Saturday. Tickets can be picked up in the Office of Student Life or at the BCSGA tent on the day of the game. Please meet us by 5:30 p.m., and all participants must wear closed-toe shoes and a red shirt (we will provide if you do not have one). Also! With your KVC card, you can get 2 free football tickets for *every* home football game! So please do promote this as well.

7. OLD BUSINESS

Items listed in this agenda item have already been read or discussed once and thus are considered for approval of the committee

a. Welcome Back Week

Discussion: It was expressed by the A.I. Computer Science Club that they were disappointed with how the Student Involvement Fest went for clubs. There were dilemmas with tables that were reserved prior to the event, but were not provided. It was also addressed by the Veterans Club that they maintained a tent out for a full week to let students know all about their club, and to have them familiar with them, such that other clubs should do the same.

b. Student Leadership Conference (Oct 3, 2015 at BC)

Discussion: It was addressed as a reminder that the Student Leadership Conference is on Saturday, October 3rd from 9:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. There will be a small \$10.00 fee to attend, and there will be an etiquette tutorial dinner in this conference along with all of the workshops. There will be an update email coming out soon with more information and a link to sign up, but the links are already on the Bakersfield College website. The link will also have a way to be able to pay electronically, instead of only in person. There will be keynote speakers, and Morgan Clayton will be speaking There are breakout sessions, and CSUB is also collaborating with us in facilitating this event. So for ever BC speaker, there will be a CSUB speaker. There will also be discussion groups for "like-minded individuals" (such as presidents with presidents and student leaders with other student leaders). There is a 200 student limit (so 100 spots for CSUB and 100 spots for BC approximately).

- c. Appoints to BCSGA Committees and BC Participatory Committees
 <u>Discussion</u>: Most people who are interested have already been submitted, and there are still a few pending but they are underway. Any more interested students please see BCSGA President Fowler.
- 2015 BC Homecoming (week of 10/12)
 <u>Discussion</u>: It was advised for all members to please read and review the Homecoming Packet. The theme for this year is Shades of the Renegade: #TheBCCollage. Additionally, it was discussed that BCSGA would be having a competition against the counseling department on October 14th. It was expressed by the Veterans club that it is possible for teams to win by putting "all of their eggs into one basket". For example, if a team heavily invests their points in the Renegade Pantry competition without really participating in the other competitions, then they have the possibility of winning the entire competition. As such, it was suggested to insure that the point system in place does take this into account.
- e. Gamers Night Out

Discussion: This idea was presented by the Japanese Culture Club, where an event would be held such that all students gather together to play video games for a certain set of time. While playing the games, there would be a fundraiser and all proceeds would go towards the Children's Network Hospital in town. The concept of the event is centered on Extra Life which is an event held by the gamers club at CSUB. The club would later provide further details as they would get in contact to collaborate with the head facilitator.

8. NEW BUSINESS

Discussion:

- Gender Sexuality and Awareness: We are doing the Trevor Project, looking to collaborate with other clubs to hold the "Vagina Monologues" play on campus, and holding safe space workshops. These workshops are to help empower students, prevent discrimination, and suicide.
- A.I. Computer Science: Our club is hoping to do student-led "Ted Talks". We will need a lot of collaboration from other clubs.

- c. StudOrg Workshops for the semester

Discussion: There are workshops planned next month for an entire week. There will also be a possible workshop on how to utilize the production team, and what resources are available to student organizations.

d. Fright Fest for Clubs

Discussion: The following ideas were presented by ICC members of events to hold during the week prior to Halloween-

- Have a lip sync battle for students
- Have a Halloween type of ball
- Have a trick or treat event for junior high kids
- Have a safe Halloween event for kids/children, where it could be an event that is partnered with the day care on campus, and have the community come onto campus to go trick-or-treating.
- Host a Halloween themed fair, where buildings or rooms could be decorated to hold a "haunted house", or to even use the gym
