According to the Occupation Overview EMSI Q3 2018 Data Set regarding Kern County:

- There are three occupations which correspond with the certificate in Graphic Design: Graphic Designers, Desktop Publishers, Prepress Technicians and Workers.
- The growth for Graphic Designers between 2018 and 2027 is 8%, going from 391 jobs to 423 jobs.
- The growth for Desktop Publishers is negative, going from 15 to 14 during the 2017 to 2027 timeframe, resulting in a 7% loss.
- The growth for Prepress Technicians and Workers is also negative, going from 22 to 20 in the timeframe, resulting in a -9% loss.

Comment: As the nation and world increasingly rely on electronic media for information (web, apps, etc...) the need for printing will remain flat to slightly negative. However, the need for visual communicators, i.e. graphic designers will increase, as their products (images, branding, logotypes, etc...) will also easily transfer to and be needed by electronic platforms.

4. Prior to developing the certificate, the faculty consulted with the local advisory committee and sought out their advice regarding courses and software appropriate to Kern County. In addition, graphic design faculty regularly attend national and regional conferences to follow large trends in the industries of graphic design, web design, illustration, typography...

The faculty discusses the effectiveness of the certificate every time there is an advisory board meeting. As we continue to develop internships and opportunities for students to get real-world experience, we will also monitor these situations to ascertain student effectiveness.

5. The annual completion target is 15. According to PERKINS IV Core Indicators of Performance by 6-digital Vocational TOP Code, the program saw 24 completions in the Summary Detail Report for 2018-2019 Fiscal Year Planning document. If these numbers are correct, the program is exceeding the target. However, increasing the outreach to high schools, increasing contact with Counselors on campus, and continuous review and monitoring of curriculum and scheduling will assure continued success for the certificate.

The faculty in the graphic design program has cooperated with the faculty in the photography and media arts program to produce a poster to distribute to high schools. Continuing these efforts, as well as electronic publications (blogs, social media, etc...) will help keep the certificate information available to potential students.
