There is a separate folder in SharePoint for the COMP TIA cert, but it contains no evaluation documents. Rewrite Goal #1 to make is measurable. Goal #2 isn’t a program goal, it’s an intended curriculum change. This planning document provides the place for large-scale planning to meet hiring needs of the region and student success needs within the program. This “goal” addresses neither.
