STATE BUDGET ÅNALYSIS

- Currently not very much information regarding the potential impacts of recession State revenues – Revenues for 22-23 are coming in around 8% less than budgeted thus far
- 2021-22 revenues came in approximately \$49.2 billion over budget
- Resulted in an additional \$4 billion in additional resources for community colleges
- Significant one-time spending to avoid the State Appropriation Limit
- COLA is set at 6.56% and 0.5% growth are allocated to the SCFF as well as an increase in the base allocation

COLLEGE BUDGET PREMISE

- Increase of revenue due to the SCFF, COLA and base of \$17.8 million
 - Basic \$10.9 million
 - Credit \$69.4 million
 - Dual Enrollment \$12.1 million
 - Incarcerated and non-credit \$3.3 million
 - Supplemental \$31.7 million
 - Success \$16.9 million
- Step/Column increases 2.5%
- PERS (10.7%) and STRS (12.9%) increases
- Increase in number of faculty to due increase in the FON, taking advantage of dollars from state to invest in FT faculty, and opportunities to grow emerging programs

SIGNIFICANT ONE-TIME ITEMS

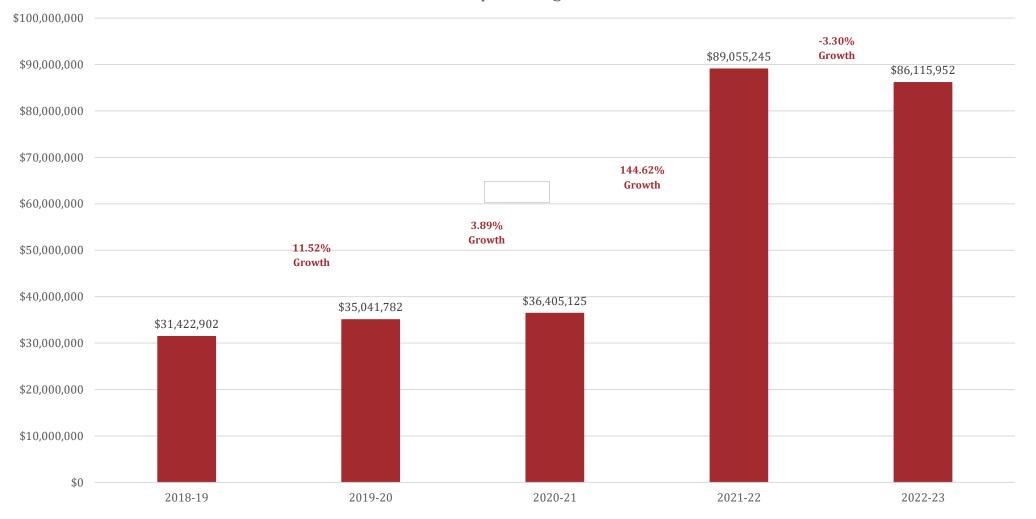
- KCCD is allocation \$50 million to support the creation of the California Renewable Energy Center of Excellence
- The Delano LRC construction project was re-funded
- Deferred maintenance awarded at \$12.3 million
- BC's student housing project was funded for \$60.2 million (see next slide)

BC STUDENT HOUSING TIMELINE

- Late September 2021: The state shared information regarding the housing grant opportunity.
- October 2021: KCCD Board of Trustees meeting (Item 9.B)
- November 4, 2021: Application submitted to the Higher Education Student Housing Grant Program
- November 22, 2021: BC's Budget Open Forum
- May 10, 2022: BC Tentative Budget
- May 10, 2022: Budget Summary Tentative Exec Review
- July 15, 2022: Press Release on state funding allocated for student housing projects at BC, CC, and PC.
- July 19, 2022: President Dadabhoy's Renegade Update
- August 18, 2022: Opening Day Construction Update
- September 12, 2022: Budget Committee Meeting
- October 21, 2022: BC's College Council
- October 26, 2022: District Consultation Council Updates
- Meanwhile, architect drawings have been completed and the plans have been submitted for DSA review
- Expected to break ground spring 2023

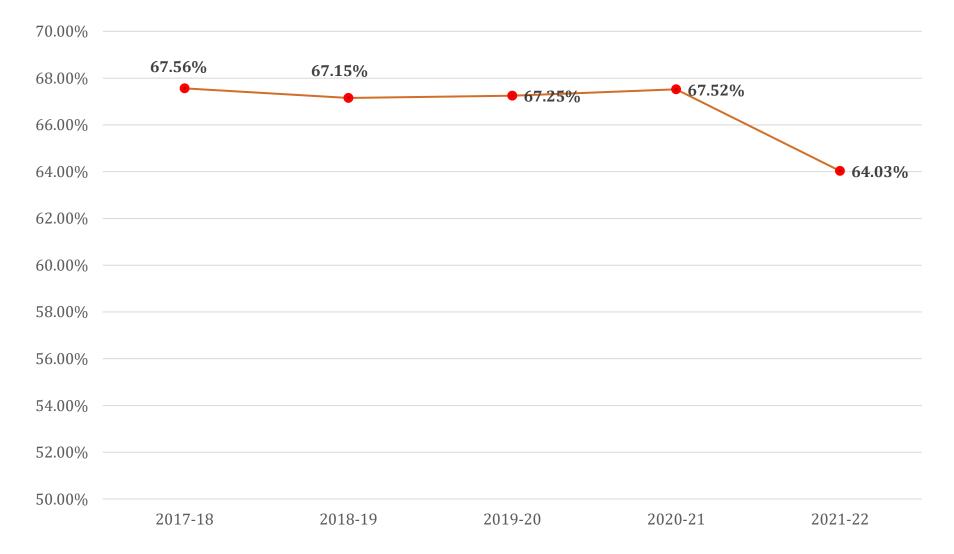


Categorical/Restricted Funding Adopted Budgets
