Committee Term Cheat Sheet

Participatory Governance Committee: committee that has a prescribed number of representatives from academic, classified, and/or administrative staff, as well as students.

- As of February 11, participatory governance committees include: AIQ, Assessment, Bookstore, Budget, Curriculum*, Enrollment Management, EODAC, Facilities & Sustainability, ISIT, Professional Development, Program Review, and Safety.
- Proposed By-Laws change will move Curriculum from participatory governance committee to Academic Senate committee.

Academic Senate Committee: committee listed in the Senate By-Laws as a standing committee of the Academic Senate (Article VIII - Committees, Section 5). Faculty only voting membership. Senate committee works only on a "10+1" item.

- As of February 11, only Equivalency is an Academic Senate committee.
- Proposed By-Laws change will add Curriculum to the list of Academic Senate committees. Students need to still have a voice on Curriculum as part of the Student "9+1" which include several that overlap with the Senate's 10+1: grading policies, curriculum development, courses or programs which should be initiated or discontinued, processes for institutional planning and budget development, and standards and policies regarding student preparation and success.
