Ongoing Projects

Relocate Security and HR – Security relocated to Maintenance and Operations building. Preparations to new HR space still underway with HVAC air balance, patch and paint, furniture purchase.

Foster Youth (current HR), Furniture purchases have been made, will move Foster Youth as soon as HR has been relocated.

Campus Security Upgrades – Currently meeting with Campus Security for recommendation on camera locations.

Measure J Projects

Utility Project – Thermal Imagining, Elevation study, bore and test, map existing systems, receive report/recommendations. RFP for repairs per report/recommendations.

Fire Alarm System evaluation — Evaluating options to improve campus fire alarm system and mass notification.

Gym Floor – SOW to include complete gym floor replacement, coaches' row floor replacement, gym foyer terrazzo floor restoration, new PA system, new wall pads, new ball return, bleacher maintenance, ball return for top row of bleacher system. Project schedule April 29 – August 2, 2019.

Restroom Renovation- Working drawings 50%, Construction schedule April 1, 2020 – November 30, 2020. To include Academic Center exterior and interior men's/women's restrooms. Gym Foyer men's/women' restrooms. If funding allows Fine Arts men's/women's restroom's.

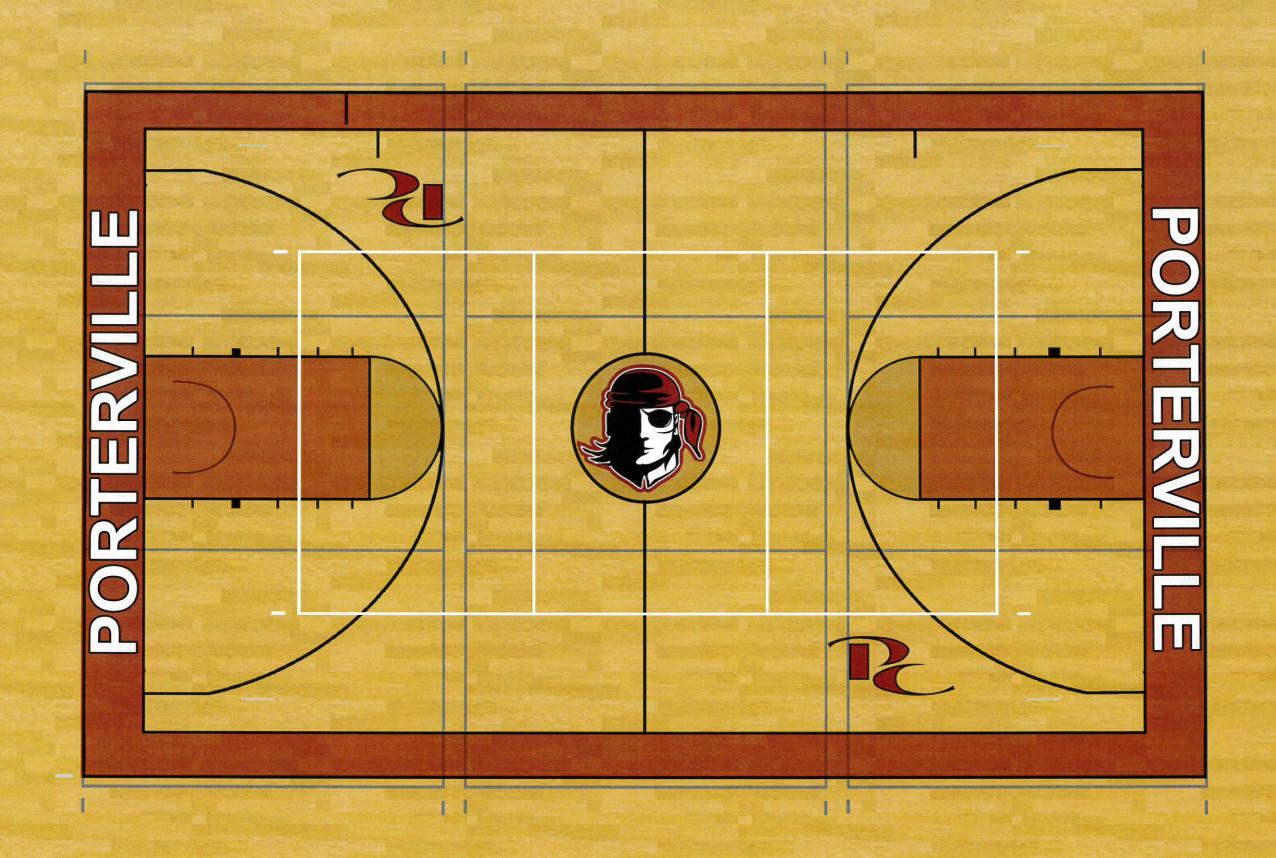
Kitchen Plumbing- Replace all plumbing in kitchen, grill and dishwashing area as needed. Kitchen will be down for approximately 5 months. Limited food service will be provided out of the SCCR. 3.14.20 – 8.9.20. Several comments came out of CC meeting wanting food catering trucks during the kitchen down time.

FFE Garage Computer Tables – Evaluated Several desk manufactures and tested 3 in LRC 513 to see if they fit PC computer equipment. One desk was purchased for trial and two loaners donated. The two loaners had to be returned. One loaner will be returned to allow faculty/staff input for consideration to accept IT recommendation. Loaner table scheduled for delivery April 11th. Computer labs scheduled to receive new tables are: LRC 449, AC 121, LRC 513, FA 1. (approx. 59 tables total).
