**Tuition and Costs** 

GCU has not increased tuition since 2009

 In the 2022-23 academic year, after GCU-funded scholarships, the average tuition was \$9,200 annually

 Room and board rates: Starting \$3,525/semester for 2022-231

 In 2022, GCU's traditional campus students received over \$180 million in scholarships

#### Indirect Academic Scholarship Program

#### Transfer, GAP Year and High School International F-1 Visa Students

Students who are enrolling with GCU and are not eligible for the high school academic scholarship program (enrolled at GCU the semester following high school graduation), or students who are attending with an International F-1 Visa may be eligible for a transfer scholarship. A transfer scholarship is based on a student's unweighted high school GPA, their cumulative college transfer GPA if they have six or more college credits, or their ACT/SAT scores. ACT/SAT scores require a minimum 2.5 unweighted high school GPA.

School/district/organizations staff, faculty and/or personnel are also eligible. To participate, the program requires a signed MOU by both the student and parent/guardian or personnel, approval of travel dates by GCU and receipts submitted per GCU requirements. Travel reimbursement thresholds vary based on location and education sector. Only one form of travel will be reimbursed, air OR ground. GCU does not reimburse hotel expenses, baggage costs, early check-in or travel insurance fees. Travel reimbursement usually occurs within 45 days
