

Resolution to Expedite Complete CVC-OEI Implementation

Cerro Coso Community College Academic Senate

Whereas the Cerro Coso Community College Academic Senate passed a resolution in the Spring of 2018 resolving that Cerro Coso apply for admission into the CVC-OEI Exchange;

Whereas students are challenged to complete degrees and certificates when courses are impacted and can take courses from teaching colleges in the exchange and transfer those units to their home college;

Whereas KCCCD has a breadth of online course offerings ready for students to cross-enroll in and a long history of successful online teaching;

Whereas completion of phase 2 integration is required to establish cross-enrollment within the California Community Colleges and streamline financial aid processes for KCCCD colleges to offer courses in the exchange as teaching colleges;

Whereas offering courses in the exchange allows KCCCD to sustain current enrollment if not increase online enrollments while keeping students state-wide on their educational paths in impacted courses;

Resolved, that Cerro Coso Community College Academic Senate advocates for increasing the priority of phase 2 integration of the CVC-OEI exchange project once the required Banner updates have been completed.
